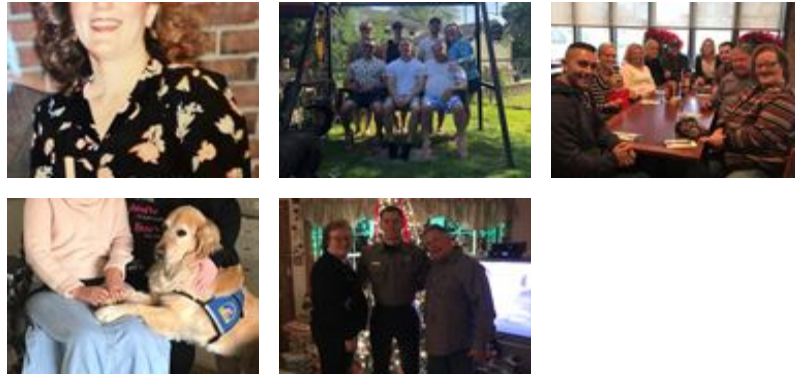

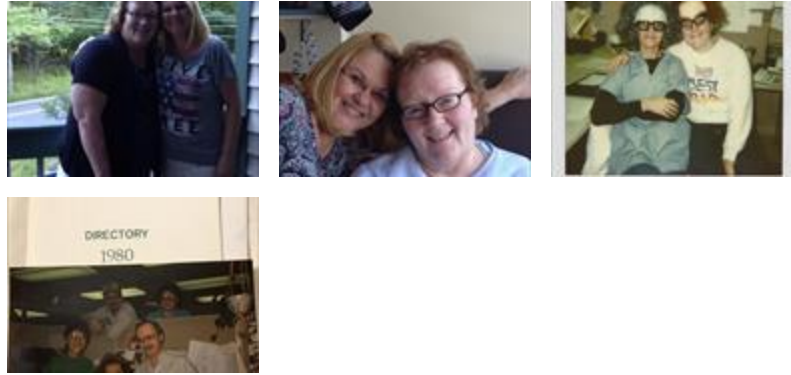
“ I first met Cindy in the mid 80” s. We were just two young girls working for Scarborough trying to figure out life. We had so much in common, we just clicked. From new husbands, to new babies, to figuring out our emotions on how to leave our babies at home while we went to work. We discussed everything. For the last few years of our employment there, they put us in the basement right next to each other. One of the best times of my life. Did you ever know someone who just knew how to tell a story, well Cindy was that person. And somehow, somehow she brought her humor into each and every story. The story could be tragic and somehow, we would wind up laughing. We would discuss everything from problems with our hubbies, to raising young babies, to in-laws. And she had great in-law stories. We were both fortunate to have our family babysit our babies, but it was still difficult leaving them. I remember she would burst into our cubical saying things like “they did it again, Cathy, they did it again. She would go into some story about how she smells oils and how they would be rubbing oils on Michael. I’d ask how she knew this, she said she would smell it on his feety jammies. And she would go into this song and dance on how she’d be smelling everything in the house. She was hysterical. She was so animated.

No one has ever made me laugh as much as Cindy. There was always some kind of prank her and Paul Rutter were planning. Everyday there was something. It was a joy going to work. Every year we would all dress up for Halloween. But Cindy always took it a step further. She would stay in character all day long. I have attached a picture of the funniest day of my life. We were both crazy scientists. Every time I would look to my left, she would go into some crazy story acting like this scientist.

She was handed a real blow the last time we worked together. Breast cancer had struck but did not destroy her. She had a new baby to look forward to and two young boys to parent. So, she fought a great fight. I will never know anyone who was stronger than Cindy. She always kept a great attitude no matter what she was handed. She is the definition of WARRIOR.

Our career lives went different ways, but we kept in touch though

out the years. Cindy was a great friend, the kind of friend you could pick up a phone years later and it was like yesterday we were sitting next to each other discussing our lives and the turns our road has taken us.
