*12 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.*

*2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.*

*3 For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith.*

*9 Let love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good.*

*10 Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another;*

*11 Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord;*

*12 Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer;*

*13 Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality.*

*14 Bless them which persecute you: bless, and curse not.*

*15 Rejoice with them that do rejoice, and weep with them that weep.*

*16 Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits.*

*17 Recompense to no man evil for evil. Provide things honest in the sight of all men.*

*18 If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men.*

*19 Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but rather give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance is mine; I will repay, saith the Lord.*

*20 Therefore if thine enemy hunger, feed him; if he thirst, give him drink: for in so doing thou shalt heap coals of fire on his head.*

*21 Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good.*
