Francis Osenbach, of Cinnaminson, New Jersey passed away peacefully at home on April 23, 2024. He was 92 years old, born in 1932 to Charles and Hannah (née Moore) Osenbach. He was an amazing father (and father-in-law) to Ruth, Rich, David, and Brett, grandfather to Kelly, Lindsey, and Courtney, great-grandfather to Parker and Chase, and brother to Kenneth. A few weeks before his passing you could even find him outside mowing the lawn, and then rewarding himself by sneaking a cigarette or two.

He will be truly missed by his family, his friends, and by anyone who ever had the pleasure of knowing him.
