July 4, 1929 - March 23, 2025

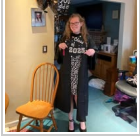

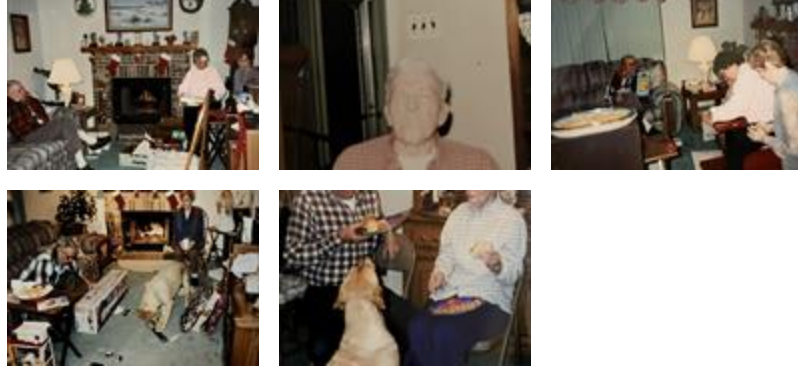

Services were private for George.

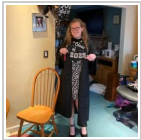
