Virginia Waltena Alexander-Lauber, age 85, of East Fallowfield, PA, passed peacefully at home in the early morning of December 14, 2023. Born April 23, 1938 in Philadelphia, PA, Virginia was the firstborn child of Walter James Alexander, Jr. and Virginia Bernice Alexander (nee: Herd).

Virginia displayed talents in art, writing, and singing from childhood, and was a very skilled seamstress. She was a lifelong knitter, crocheter, and crafter, and loved giving handmade gifts to friends and family, and making hats and scarves for charity. She worked as a nurse caring for senior citizens for several years, before becoming a bank teller; and retired from Navy Federal Credit Union in Bethesda, MD. She also worked as a karaoke host in the Washington, DC area; and remained an avid karaoke singer after moving to Dover, DE after retirement - a passion she enjoyed right to the end.

Virginia was preceded in death by her parents, stepparents (Ruth Alexander, William Scott), and three husbands (Paul Berner; Albert Murphy, Sr.; and William Lauber, Jr.). She is survived by her fiancé, Fredrick Camenzind, Jr.
